Building upon the foundation of our 36-year commitment to building homes, communities, and hope, Greater Indy Habitat for Humanity completed a record-setting year of impact in 2023. In response to the growing need for affordable, quality housing solutions in our community and across the globe, we partnered with individuals and families to provide an historic 165 housing solutions.

This milestone propels Habitat toward our production goal of 300 housing solutions by the end of 2024 as outlined in our three-year strategic plan. In addition to providing first-time homeownership, owner-occupied home repairs, and housing solutions in El Salvador and Kenya, our affiliate created new and continued opportunities to engage with our mission.

In 2023 we launched our inaugural CEO Build, which brought together leaders from various industries to build homes alongside Habitat homebuyers. This initiative not only fostered meaningful connections within our community but also underscored the importance of collective action in addressing the pressing issue of affordable housing. Our Building Futures event hosted Dr. Andre Perry as he shared his research on people-centric solutions for affordable homeownership.

Symone wanted to become a homeowner to have the ability to provide stability and a place where her son could grow up. She longed for a place they could call their own. "I have spent much time getting myself together and preparing for this next step in my journey, which includes becoming a first-time mom while attending school and trying to work to support my son. I want to be better, not just for him but for myself."

Now, they are in their new home where Nasir has his own room and Symone has more space for herself again. They enjoy having a home where they can go outside, and Nasir can play safely. She can now mark Nasir's growth and hang his drawings on the refrigerator.

Everyone has plans they look forward to once they are homeowners. For Symone, she was excited about learning how to mow the lawn: "As funny as it sounds, growing up when my parents were together, I can remember how much pride my dad took in mowing his yard and making our home look good." She remembered that feeling her dad had, and now she can experience it for herself.

Her son, Nasir, loves basketball and plays all day long. Symone is happy to finally have a place where she can build a basketball court for him outside. Before, they were living with Symone's mother who didn't care for Nasir riding his paw patrol scooter around the house. Now, they have a place where he can be free to roam.

Doris says Habitat provided the only consistent thing during the pandemic: her home. She suffered from unexpected strokes since 2008 and was diagnosed with Graves' disease just before moving into her Habitat home. COVID was a hard time for us all, but for Doris, it helped. It gave her time to be home to treat and recover from her illness. "It was a haven for me. Going from an apartment, where people are coming and going constantly, to your home, you just feel a sense of comfort and peace of mind. I could sleep better because it took a lot of my worries away. Here, I could never feel put out of my own house."

"I describe it as uncertainty verses security," Doris shared. "Whatever is going on outside, when I close that door, it doesn't matter." It also gave her time to focus on finishing school. Doris wanted to learn more about how to help those with addictions. "It was something I could say was truly mine. I could be selfish with this." She received her bachelor's degree in community psychology the same year she purchased her home.


Since becoming a homeowner, she sees herself starting healthier habits. She sees herself as a happier person because she can finally concentrate on herself. Doris also mentioned a difference in her grandchildren, Joe and Messiah, since coming to live with her. She explains how their behavior improved. "They have structure here." She noticed they began making the honor roll and thrived academically. Joe now attends Ball State University, pursuing sports medicine, and Messiah will graduate from high school in 2025, the same year Doris will finish her master's degree.


